

MEMBERSHIP IN THE FELLOWSHIP

Membership participation has three requirements and they are:

- 1. A desire to live and improve upon a life of sobriety and purity on a daily basis.
- 2. A <u>daily</u> Rule of Prayer reading from the Akathist of the Inexhaustible Cup booklet, pages 13-14, Kontakion 1, Ikos 1, and also pages 29-31, Kontakion 13, First Prayer, Second Prayer, and the Troparion. This set of prayers takes less than ten (10) minutes a day. The rule of prayer also includes forming a list of individuals, family members, and friends for whom each member chooses to pray for.
- 3. A free-will offering each month is used for the purpose of developing and sponsoring conferences related to the treatment of addictions, as well as publishing articles and granting clergy financial assistance when needed.

The Fellowship's financial well-being is founded on the Biblical precept of faithful tithing. Thus, in addition to the Fellowship soliciting funds for its own existence, a portion of contributions received by the Fellowship will be consistently given to help support causes that are actively involved in helping people to secure and maintain sobriety, and to gain meaning and purpose to their lives in doing so. Specific first causes to be aided include Orthodox monasteries, churches with outreach programs, and missions.

The overall goal of this fellowship is to provide and establish a network of intercessory prayer and support among its members in order to combat the many destructive forces of addictions present in our day and age.



PERSONAL INVITATION

Our Lady of the Inexhaustible Cup invites all of its members to come under her Omophorion and receive her holy protection, intercession, and assistance. She promises to make a very important commitment to us which can be found in the Akathist to the Mother of God, The Inexhaustible Cup.

"No one departs empty-handed from the Inexhaustible Cup of divine gifts, O all-good One, so that having received healing from Thy miraculous Icon they may with thanksgiving sing to Thee: Alleluia!" (Kontakion 12)

Our Lady of the Inexhaustible Cup offers her precious child Jesus inside the Holy Mystery of Communion as a means and an end to the healing of every known addiction and its destructive influence. She also makes clear to all who pray the Akathist to the Inexhaustible Cup that she herself is the Holy Chalice which contains His most precious body and blood.

"Rejoice, Chalice by which we receive the joy of our salvation." (Ikos 3)

"Rejoice, Cup drawing forth joy from the source of immortality." (Ikos 4)

"Rejoice, Chalice of life and immortality that leads to the gates of eternal life." (Ikos 6)

"Rejoice, heavenly Chalice of divine gifts." (Kontakion 7)

Our Lady of the Inexhaustible Cup desires that all clergy and people consider her to be the Holy Chalice inseparable from Christ's gift the Holy Eucharist. As we approach Holy Communion, let us remember that Christ's precious body and blood are offered simultaneously by the Living Tabernacle, the Holy Dispenser, who is the Theotokos. She paid a great price to participate in this gift of the Eucharist. For let us not forget the words of the Holy Prophet Simeon who spoke this prophecy to her: "Your heart will be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many shall be laid bare."

Let our hearts overflow with joy when we hear the deacon's prayer, "Calling to remembrance our most holy, most pure, most blessed, glorious Lady Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary with all the saints, let us commit ourselves and one another and all our life unto Christ Our God."

"Rejoice, immaculate One, whose purity cleanses our impurity." (Ikos 10)

We will pray daily in the Second Prayer:

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

In the year 1878, there appeared a miraculous icon called 'The Inexhaustible Cup', which is located at a women's monastery in the city of Serpukhov, Russia. It is known for its countless miracles and healing of every manner of addiction including: alcohol, drugs, sex, gambling, pornography, codependency and for the cure of many other illnesses. Not long after the appearance of this icon, a Brotherhood of Sobriety was formed and developed, but when it was doing the most good it was dismembered by the Soviet government.

Today's fellowship is founded on the historical precedent of this Brotherhood which developed twenty years after the appearance of this miraculous icon and continues to be committed to combating and aiding in the treatment and manner of addictions. It will produce articles, sponsor workshops, and direct retreats, prayer gatherings, and educational programs for its members and inquirers. Significantly, at the end of the 19th century, a great saint and his saintly wife (St. John of Kronstadt and Matushka Elizabeth) dedicated their lives to the healing of the addicted and afflicted of their time. They were known for the acquisition of the highest virtues rooted in their primary commitment of intercessory prayer for those around them who were in need. This produced great fruit in the form of healing and an abundance of charity work. We, as a married couple, and the founding members of this Fellowship, seek to emulate the life and practice of this sanctified couple.

The members of this Fellowship of the Inexhaustible Cup committed to improving their sobriety and purity are dedicated to the Icon of the Mother of God, "Our Lady of the Inexhaustible Cup" by praying for one another. The non-profit sponsor and spiritual father of the Fellowship and our marriage is Archpriest Fr. Gordon Walker, founder of St. Ignatius Antiochian Orthodox Church, Franklin, TN. We are deeply grateful to him for his love and support over the years.
